From the Classroom

Science- Physics- Investigating friction forces.



Our study of friction as a force continues. The students watched an excellent you tube clip demonstrating how different surfaces show friction at work. The students then had to repeat this experiment in small groups. This required them to learn how to use materials in a science experiment. Next, each group demonstrated how their experiment performed to all other groups. Finally they explained why the sandpaper, alfoil and wooden surfaces behaved differently when all other variables were kept the same. Thanks to the school budget for supplying all the materials. Parents can help by showing their children examples of friction at home. Send photos so they can be added to their PowerPoint as their own research. This all adds to their assessment grade for science.

Digital Technology

Our PowerPoint presentations are progressing slowly. The students have been able to find photos that they have taken and stored on the computer system. Next they have embedded a photo in a PowerPoint page and attempted to write a simple sentence about the photo. Their presentation will be used for assessment of their ability to use this digital tool to show their understanding of friction forces in the world around them. Parents with computers could help the development of these skills by helping their child to use a keyboard.

Technologies for entertainment: past and present



Changes in entertainment technology was the focus of our last history lesson. The students were able to sort photos into a simple timeline to show how people have used technology to entertain themselves. The timeline images were glued in their HASS journals. Parents can help by talking about how they entertained themselves in the past. Even better send along a real object (artefact) that was used with some information as the students are expected to research these history topics.
